**ORDER NO 4/2025
OF THE DIRECTOR FOR EDUCATION
UNIVERSITY CENTRE FOR ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES AND SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT
of 23.09.2025
on organisational rules for the implementation of teaching activities**

Pursuant to § 7(5) and § 33 of the Regulations of Studies at the University of Warsaw, as well as Rector's Order No. 111 of 16 September 2021 on the organisation of teaching classes, examinations and credits in remote mode (Monitor UW 2021 item 222), as amended by Rector's Order No. 155 of 23 October 2023 (Monitor UW 2023 item 365) and Rector's Order No. 45 of 17 March 2025 (Monitor UW 2025 item 84), in agreement with the Director of the University Centre for Environmental Studies and Sustainable Development, in order to ensure the implementation of programme content and learning outcomes in the study programmes offered by UCBS, I hereby order as follows:

§ 1

In the winter and summer semesters of the academic year 2025/2026, teachers may conduct up to two classes in each teaching group in a non-standard form, if this is necessary to fully implement the programme content and achieve the intended learning outcomes.

§ 2

Permissible forms of classes are:

- 1) remote synchronous meetings (after agreeing the date with students),
- 2) asynchronous remote forms,
- 3) extended consultations,
- 4) field classes.

§ 3

The choice of form rests with the teacher, who is obliged to ensure that students can achieve all intended learning outcomes. Students must be informed of the chosen form at least 24 hours in advance.



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§ 4

This Order is organisational in nature and does not change the mode of study specified in the curricula approved by the Senate of the University of Warsaw.

§ 5

This Order enters into force on the date of its signature.
